This quaint and walkable town provides residents with a peaceful lifestyle while maintaining access to local events, services, and preserved historical character.

Town Overview

- Established in 1824 and listed on the National Register of Historic Places
- Maintains its own U.S. Post Office
- Governed by a Mayor and Town Council with monthly meetings

Town Services & Infrastructure

- Weekly curbside trash pickup at no cost to residents
- Recycling and monthly yard waste pickup (April–November)
- Snow removal for roads and alleys; Main Street maintained in coordination with county/state
- Street lighting, road maintenance, and public works funded through town and state revenue

Community & Lifestyle

- Quiet, walkable setting with residents enjoying daily outdoor activity
- Local businesses include Gilligan's Dry Goods Store and Jamie Marshall's Jewelry Shop
- Community events include Easter Egg Hunt, 4th of July celebration, Spook Hill Run, and fishing contests
- South Mountain Heritage Association hosts museum exhibits and events nearby

Parks, Grounds & Improvements

- Town maintains parks, playgrounds, and green spaces including Guyton Scenic Park
- Annual mowing and maintenance of public areas
- EPA grant of approximately \$365,000 secured for stormwater and green space improvements (planning stage)
